Let residents know about yourself, your background and any personal, work or voluntary interests you're involved in:

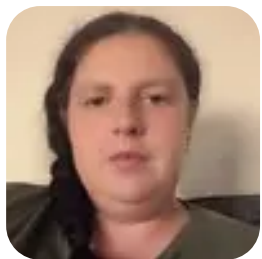
