Your Village

Lightmoor Village was created by Bournville Village Trust and has many green spaces, play areas, meadows and orchards.



It's also known for its community spirit, where every resident has the opportunity to be involved. On the Your Village section of our website you can find out more information about:

The BVT Lightmoor Team are based in the Oak Tree Community Centre (opposite the village centre connected to the school). The team provide the estates and stewardship services within the village. Services range from supporting residents during applications for home alterations and improvements to liaising with developers before areas are officially handed over to us.

The team also provide opportunities for resident involvement, whether it's attending the activities/events they have organised or joining a community group such as the green gang. There is also a team of caretakers who work to keep the village clean, green and safe. The caretakers work on a rota (available on our website) to ensure all areas of the village are maintained. But also respond to any sudden urgent maintenance required for example, clearing up after storms or repairing park equipment.

Get Involved There's always lots of opportunities to get involved within the community, whether it's joining a group or coming to one of the many activities/events that are held throughout the year.





Lightmoor Village Estate Management Committee



The Lightmoor Village Estate Management Committee (LVEMC) is the resident-led committee responsible for overseeing the work of BVT's estates and stewardship services.

The committee is responsible for:

- Considering and recommending the annual budget for the Stewardship Charge, which is paid by all residents.
- · Receiving quarterly financial reports on expenditure against budget, estate management activities, community engagement and local partnership working and development in Lightmoor Village.
- Approving an annual service plan which prioritises plans and projects.
- Approving the annual planned maintenance programme.
- Being involved in the regular review of the Lightmoor Village Design Guide and approving any amendments.
- Reviewing and reaching decisions on appeals regarding home alteration applications.

Your Home

Lightmoor Village Design Guide details the alterations that can be made to your home according to your covenants (see below). The updated Lightmoor Design Guide was launched in



2024. The BVT team are available to support throughout the process of applying for an alteration.

Covenants and breaches When buying/renting a home, a TP1 document or tenancy agreement is signed. The agreement details what can and can't be done to the outside of your home and within its boundaries (these are called covenants).

If a covenant is broken, it can lead to the start of the breach process, which could result in you having to apply for retrospective permission or even undo the work that has been carried out. We never want this to happen, so always advise getting in touch before you start, so we can guide you through the process.

Stewardship Charge All Lightmoor Village residents, regardless of whether you're a tenant or homeowner, pay the stewardship charge, which goes towards the running of Lightmoor Village.

What to do when selling your home We hope you will be happy in Lightmoor Village for many years but if the time comes to sell your home, there are processes to follow and full details are available on our website or pop in and speak to one of the team.

Oak Tree Community Centre


